Union Health and Terre Haute Regional Hospital Merger

Background

According to the Indiana Department of Health's (IDOH) county health scorecard, Vigo County faces significant public health challenges, ranking 68th in life expectancy, 54th in adult obesity, 64th in infant mortality, and 60th in suicide rate. These concerning statistics highlight the urgent need for a comprehensive solution to improve the health and well-being of the community.

In response to these challenges, Union Health and Terre Haute Regional Hospital have decided to merge, forming a unified and streamlined system of care. This partnership aims to enhance access to and the quality of healthcare services while maintaining or lowering costs for patients.

To facilitate this merger, the two entities must obtain a Certificate of Public Advantage (COPA) from the Indiana Department of Health. The COPA is essential for providing state oversight, ensuring that the new entity operates in compliance with state and federal anti-trust regulations, and displacing anti-competitive market forces.

The COPA framework fosters an unprecedented level of collaboration and strategic partnership between IDOH experts and Union Health leaders. This collaboration is expected to significantly improve healthcare access and quality for local residents. As the merger progresses, Union Health's existing programs will expand in both staff and specialization, further enhancing the quality of care provided to the community.

A note from President and CEO Steve Holman

First, it's important to understand the Certificate of Public Advantage (COPA) creates a process which Union Health can pursue this opportunity. This application process allows the Indiana Department of Health to review all data submitted by all parties to make the best decision for the community. It will be the data along with the collaborative work with the community and other health related resources that showcase why this merger will allow for big and bold changes to our healthcare metrics – for good!

This opportunity is essential because the health of our communities can and should be improved. We are at the bottom end of many healthcare rankings within the region. While access to hospital care is crucial when illness strikes, it is even more critical to focus on preventive measures that keep our communities healthy and reduce the need for hospitalization in the first place. Currently, doing things as we are today is not meeting critical needs. When evaluating health outcomes and factors, residents of the Wabash Valley rank among the least healthy in Indiana. Vigo County (alone) ranks poorly in comparison to Indiana's other 91 counties in several key performance indicators.

According to data published by the IDOH:

- 68th in life expectancy
- 60th in suicide rate
- 54th in adult obesity



We face a significant prevalence of chronic health conditions, including lung disease, diabetes, and hypertension, resulting in a population that is in critical need of accessible, high-quality care close to home. Securing the COPA is essential for enhancing the quality of and access to healthcare throughout our communities. If we keep doing the same things we're doing – our quality of life simply doesn't improve. These challenges affect our quality of life and cannot be resolved solely within the hospital. It is imperative that we invest in our communities to address the root causes of these health-related issues. The COPA puts measures in place that will hold Union Health accountable for investing more financial resources back into bettering our healthcare metrics for citizens living within the region. We firmly believe that improved health rankings are achievable and warrant our full commitment. The proposed merger will enable Union Health to extend the benefits of both existing and new programs to a broader patient population.

At Union Health, the wellbeing of our community is our top priority, making affordable and quality care essential. Currently, Vigo County ranks in the bottom 10th percentile across all health and wellness categories compared to the state average. A COPA will bolster our efforts to improve these outcomes and promote better health in our community.

This proposed merger is not just advantageous; it is vital for the long-term success of the Wabash Valley. This agreement embodies a progressive approach to healthcare that emphasizes patient outcomes and community wellbeing. As the review process unfolds, our team at Union Health looks forward to collaborating with the Indiana Department of Health to demonstrate the positive impacts this agreement will have on our community.
